<u> Aintree Davenhill Primary School – Remote Learning Expectations</u>

Although your class is not in school at the moment, it is **very important** that you continue your learning at home. Your remote learning sessions, with your teacher and teaching assistant on Google Meet, will really help you. **Your parents will read the following information together with you to make sure you understand it.**

To get the most out of your sessions and your learning at home:

- Make sure that you are ready and dressed for your session with your class (don't come on to the remote session dressed in your pyjamas).
- Don't eat during your session. Your session will only last about 30 minutes so have something to eat before or after your session. You will need your hands free to write or type your answers.
- Make sure that you are on your laptop, computer or iPad in a room such as
 your living room, dining room or kitchen not in your bedroom. There
 should be an adult around in the same room that you are working in who is
 aware of what you are doing.
- Try to make sure there are no other distractions around you when you are joining in with your session, e.g. make sure your television has been switched off.
- If possible, try to sit at a table so it easier for you to work.
- Have a pad/piece of paper and a pen/pencil ready to write any answers.
- When you join your Google Meet session, make sure you are on mute. Only click the button to unmute, if the adult taking the session asks you to.
- Your camera needs to be on at all times and you must be seen by your teacher at the start of each session.
- YOU MUST NOT RECORD OR TAKE SCREENSHOTS of any part of the online sessions OR of any adults or children taking part in the session.
- If your teacher asks you to use the chat box to send in your answers please don't use it to send messages to the group. (Only some older year groups will do this.)
- Send in your work to your class teacher as soon as you have completed it. It
 must be submitted via ClassDojo every day or paper copies must be handed
 in when you return to school. Your parents can phone the school office to ask
 for paper copies of any work you do.
